A Vision Bigger than Reality

It's an exciting time at Vandalia First United Methodist Church! Over the past month, many in our congregation have gathered to dream about what we're doing — and what we can do — to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ right here where we are planted. This season of dreaming has grown out of many things: leaders who have helped set the stage, church members who care deeply, and a shared sense that God is moving among us — giving hope, building momentum, and pointing us forward.

Right now, we're prayerfully working through all the wonderful ideas that have been shared, discerning which ones are the best fit for this moment with the resources we have. Which brings me to our next step: sometime in the next month, we'll share a Time and Talents Survey. We're asking everyone in our church household to complete it. This survey will help us over the next year — to discover, nurture, and disciple one another as we move forward in sharing the Gospel both in our church and in our community.

The survey will cover everything from participation in Sunday worship to prayer ministries, from committee work to a wide variety of other volunteer opportunities. In my mind, it may be one of the most important things we'll ever ask you to fill out — because we simply won't know what gifts and resources God has placed in this church until you tell us.

Of course, visioning can feel a little scary. A real vision is always bigger than our current reality. If it isn't, it's just a report — not a picture of what could be. And once a vision is achieved, it becomes the launching pad for the next one.

Sure, some of our ideas might fall flat. We won't know unless we try. And even if something doesn't work, we will have learned something about ourselves — and about how God is calling us to share Jesus.

During our visioning gatherings, we likened our work to a funnel. Right now, we're still at the

wide end. We've gathered nearly 40 ideas — many overlapping and nearly 50 people participated in the conversation. The hope is that whenever an idea is shared, the person sharing it is also willing to take part in making it happen. That's part of what makes this such an exciting time for Vandalia First UMC — and why learning more about how people want to be part of our ministry really matters.

So, be excited — God is doing big things here. Be active — when you see the Time and Talents Survey, take the time to fill it out as God leads you. And stay tuned — we'll continue to share both new and familiar opportunities to take part in God's mission and vision. right here where we're planted. Our timeline is still to launch something on September 1st.

Coming in September—The 30-Day Gospel Challenge— Why Join?

On the heels of our successful Laity Roundtable discussions, we have decided to do a kickoff in September with a 30 day Gospel Challenge. We have more plans in store but it is a goal to have a church family immersed in prayer and scripture. More information is in the following paragraphs. However, we wanted to give you a month to prepare or get excited about the new opportunities to grow together at First United Methodist Church of Vandalia.

Have you ever faced a dilemma, decision or simply an issue about which you were confused? You prayed. Then you questioned whether the voice you heard in your own mind was the voice of God pointing you in a direction or whether it was your voice giving back to you your own wishful thinking. This is precisely why this church is taking on the 30-day Gospel Challenge – to make disciples of all of us who can discern the will of God for our own lives. It's been said "We speak to God when we pray. God speaks to us when we read scripture."

How does one start? Well, just start. Bruce Wilkenson, a famous theologian and author of The Prayer of Jabaz and Secrets of the Vine, confessed that even he has difficulty sometimes deciding to read the Bible. He compared the Bible to chocolate. Take the first bite and you will want to eat the entire bag. True for chocolate and true for the Bible. Just read day 1 and see what happens next.

Who should take the challenge? All of us who can read! Young, old and everyone in between.

Which version of the Bible should I choose to use? There are so many! The answer...any version that works for you. NIV, NLT, The Message, King James, Revised Standard or any variation of these or others could be your choice. Maybe you'd prefer to listen rather than read. There's an app for that, or a set of CDs with famous voices (Michael W. Smith, James Early Jones, others) reading the passages. Regarding apps, the Hallow app often offers a free subscription for 30 days or more and includes a 30-day Gospel Challenge on the app. Just Google Hallow or look on Instagram for the free offer. Young readers can join in by reading or having read to them the great Bible stories found in the Gospels.

When should I read? Whenever works best for you. Early morning, not so early morning, before bedtime, over the lunch hour, listening while driving to work or while doing errands. Daily is best because you get just the right amount of scripture to ponder for that day. Don't despair if you fall behind. You can catch up. Perhaps you have a busy next day and want to read ahead. Feel free to do so.

My schedule is full and running over. How much time will this take? 15-27 minutes. You may need to ask yourself what it is you can give up to accomplish this. If it is necessary to give up something you value to make this a part of your life during September it will be all the more precious to you because of your sacrifice. Wait and see!
