The 200 millionth shoebox packed is going to a child in the Ukraine!

Record number of shoeboxes were collected and this means 4,012 more children will hear His word from Vandalia Drop Off. How awesome is this! Vandalia Drop Off shoeboxes traveled to Effingham, then on to Charlotte where they were processed and shipped. They are on their way to a hard to reach country, Mali, Burgundy, and Madagascar!!!

Please continue to pray for the boy or girl who will receive your shoebox. Pray for them to accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior and to follow and honor Him their entire lives. Continue to pray that these children will help transform their local communities and share His love with others.

Thank you for being such a blessing by coming together with other churches and individuals to bring Him the glory! As I often say, OCC would not exist without all of us working together to further His kingdom!

In 2023, OCC will be celebrating their 30th Anniversary and Vandalia Drop Off will be celebrating 15 years as a drop off. So far, Vandalia Drop Off has processed 34,006 boxes. God has done unimaginably more than we ever anticipated! Vandalia Drop Off collected 844 boxes our first year as a drop off! We've come a long way and that's because of YOU!

Perhaps He is asking each of us to step up and try new things, to pack more boxes, and to encourage more people to pack a box. If you know people not participating encourage them to do so. Not only are we blessing the children, but we too are blessed by being involved in this ministry. There is a NEED for the children to hear His word and OCC is determined to continue to reach out to the children to the ends of the earth! Let's make our 15th anniversary one to celebrate by reaching more children than we ever thought possible!

Pastor's Perspective

Philippians 4:13

"I can do all things in Christ who strengthens me."

According to most "experts" 80 percent of all New Year's Resolutions will be lost by May 1. Half of these will be a failure by the end of February. Mark Twain once jibed, "giving up a bad habit is the easiest thing in the world, I know because I've done it thousands of times."

Still, many of us will give it a try, in good conscience, on New Year's Eve. What are you planning to resolve?

Most of our resolutions are well intended. We will give up some self-destructive habit. We will spend more time with those we love. We will again pledge to spend time reading the Bible. We will be more forgiving. We will.

But good intentions do not good habits make. I am reminded of Paul's confession to his Roman friends. "Why is it I do not do the things I want to do, and do instead the things I hate to do" (Romans 5). We can relate. I have made the same resolution about losing that 25 pounds for at least the past ten years. "Remember, Tom, broccoli and not chocolate, is your friend!"

To make a new habit stick, or eliminate an old habit; takes time, diligence, and perseverance. Most experts argue at least 30, to as much as 60 days, of effort. No wonder most of us fail.

This should not, however, discourage us from trying. And the beauty of each attempt is that God is cheering for us, especially if that which we commit to, or resolve towards, fits into God's desire for our lives.

I can still remember the struggles of learning how to drive a stick shift car and my father's patient counsel as we would stop and start, stop and start, stop and start. "Tom, you will only learn if you keep at it." I did.

God speaks to us, "you can change if you keep at it." Pray for this strength. Seek this perseverance. Request this help. And know that we can change, even if we have failed a thousand times.
